Ofsted News

As you will be aware, we had some external visitors in November from Ofsted, who inspected Lavender Field School between 7th and 9th November. We have shared a link to our report of which we are very proud of. The report encapsulates some of the fantastic work that our staff to support our pupils in their learning both socially and academically. I have summarised some quotes of the report below:

"Pupils who join Lavender Field school have often experienced difficulties in their previous education settings. The move to this school is transformational for pupils. They benefit greatly from strong, caring relationships with staff."

"Each pupil is known as an individual so that expert support and therapy can be targeted to help their unique needs. This allows pupils to learn well,

and to thrive socially and emotionally"

"Beyond the academic curriculum, staff successfully support pupils to build their confidence and social skills. Pupils are proud of their achievements. They actively delight in contributing widely to school life"

"Prior to joining the school, pupils have often experienced trauma or difficulties in managing their behaviour. Staff are adept at quickly forming warm and trusting relationships with pupils. They consistently model positive behaviours for pupils. The school provides extensive therapeutic support. Over time, pupils' behaviour and their attitudes to learning improve considerably."

I am incredibly proud of the way that Lavender Field support your children and achieving a grade of 'Good', with 2 of the 4 inspected areas 'outstanding' is something that we celebrate with you all.

As a school, we continue to work relentlessly towards our school improvement plan and I would like to share with you some of our successes:

Quality of Education

Improvement task

Ensuring that activities are adapted and stretched in response to pupils' understanding. We achieve this through assessing pupils' progress within lessons and adjusting activities will ensure that progress is more rapid. We also aim to ensure that activities allow pupils to know more and remember more.

Impact

- All pupils made expected progress and some pupils made above expected progress in all subjects.
- All teaching was judged to be effective in ensuring pupils know more and remember more.
 This has been achieved by ensuring that staff have ongoing training on flashbacks, knowledge maps for both current new staff

Improvement task

Ensure that all staff are able to teach phonics according to school policy and that Pupils joining us at different key stages will have varying levels of fluency and so all staff will be able to support them regardless of age or class group.

Impact

- All children are able to access RWI giving them the best possible opportunity to be able to read with fluency and automaticity.
- External phonics training completed by reading lead and through Read Write Inc and CPD implemented for all staff in addition to the training provided by the reading coordinator
